I Thessalonians 5:11 Therefore <u>encourage one another</u> and <u>build one another up</u>, just as you are doing. [1 Corinthians 16:18, Philippians 2:29]

I Thessalonians 5:12-13 We ask you, brothers, to respect [appreciate] those who labor [toiling - working hard which results in weariness] among you and are over you [taking the lead] in the Lord and <u>admonish</u> you, [to warn and instruct] ¹³ and to esteem [consider, regard, and think] them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves. [Mark 9:50]

I Thessalonians 5:14 And we urge you, brothers, [parakleo emphasis on mutual support and encouragement within the body of Christ]

[1] admonish the idle [the slackers], [2 Thessalonians 3:6-7]
[2] encourage the fainthearted, [discouraged] [Isaiah 35:4]
[3] help the weak, [Acts 20:35, Romans 15:1-2]
[4] be patient [longsuffering] with them all. [I Corinthians 13:4a]

I Thessalonians 5:15 See that no one repays anyone evil for
evil, [Romans 12:17] but always seek to do good to one
another and to everyone. [Galatians 6:10, Romans 12:9]

I Thessalonians 5:16-18 Rejoice always, [Philippians 4:4] ¹⁷ pray without ceasing, [Luke 18:1] ¹⁸ give thanks in all circumstances; [Luke 18:1]

for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for [toward] you.

I Thessalonians 5:19-22 Do not quench [extinguish] the Spirit.
[I Timothy 4:13, 2 Timothy 1:6] ²⁰ Do not despise prophecies,
[2 Timothy 3:16 - nature; 1 Peter 1:20-21 - method] ²¹ but test
everything; hold fast what is good. [I John 4:1-3] ²²Abstain from

- [1] Read I Thessalonians 5:11. How can we practically encourage and support each other?

- How can we practice the principle of non-retaliation with others, and each other?
- [4] Discuss the three vital choices mentioned in I Thessalonians 5:16-18 (choosing joy, praying constantly, and choosing gratitude). How can these choices impact our daily lives and spiritual growth?
- [5] Read I Thessalonians 5:23-24, John 17:17, I Corinthians 1:9, and Philippians 1:6. What does it mean for God to sanctify us completely, and how does this assurance of His faithfulness influence our faith journey?
- [6] Pray for God to give us an awareness of the six priorities we are called to as believers as we do life together.
