But [the leper] went out and began to talk freely about [what had happened] and to spread the news, so that Jesus could no longer openly enter a town, but was out in desolate places, and people were coming to him from every quarter. [Mark 1:45]

Mark 1:1-8 The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. [Mark 14:33] <sup>2</sup> As it is written in Isaiah the prophet, [Isiah 40:3-5] "Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way, [Malachi 3:1] <sup>3</sup> the voice of one crying in the wilderness: [John 1:23, Isaiah 40:3] 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight,'" [Luke 1:76]

<sup>4</sup> John appeared, [John 1:6-7] baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance [Acts 2:38, Mark 1:14-15] for the forgiveness of sins. [Mark 26:28, Luke 1:77] <sup>5</sup> And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. [Acts 19:18] <sup>6</sup> Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist and ate locusts and wild honey. [2 Kings 1:7-8] <sup>7</sup> And he preached, saying, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. [John 1:15, 26-28 3:30-31, Acts 13:23-25] <sup>8</sup> I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." [Acts 1:4-5, 11:15-16]

**Mark 1:9-11** In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. [Matthew 2:23] <sup>10</sup> And when he came up out of the water, immediately he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. [John 1:32-33, Luke 4:18,21 (Isiah 61:1-2), Acts 2:54-56, 10:36-38] <sup>11</sup> And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." [John 12:28, Mark 9:7, Ephesians 1:6, Psalm 2:7, Isaiah 42:1, Colossians 1:13, 2 Peter 1:17, I John 5:9]

**Mark 1:12-13** The Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. [Mark 4:1-11, Luke 4:1-13] <sup>13</sup> And he was in the wilderness forty days, [Mark 1:12, Matthew 4:1-11, Luke 4:1-13] being tempted by Satan. [Hebrews 2:18, 4:15] And he was with the wild animals, and the angels were ministering to him. [Luke 22:43]

Mark 1:14:15 Now after John was arrested, [Matthew 4:12, 14:3, Luke 3:20, John 3:24] Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God, [Matthew 4:17,23] <sup>15</sup> and saying, "The time is fulfilled, [Daniel 9:25, Galatians 4:4, Ephesians 1:10, Luke 21:8, John 7:8] and the kingdom of God is at hand; [Matthew 3:2], repent and believe in the gospel." [Acts 20:21, Hebrews 6:1]

## Study Questions/Prayer

- [1] How does the fulfillment of prophecy in Mark 1:1-8 establish the identity and mission of Jesus?
- [2] What is the significance of Jesus' baptism and the events that followed, as described in Mark 1:9-11?
- [3] How does Jesus' response to temptation in the wilderness found in Mark 1:12-13 demonstrate His readiness for His ministry?
- [4] Pray for God to help you live out your faith with integrity and compassion, drawing others to the hope and salvation found in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
