Study Questions/Prayer

[1] Read Mark 3:1-5. How did Jesus respond to the Pharisees' challenge about healing on the Sabbath, and what was their reaction? [2] Read Mark 3:13-19. What was the significance of Jesus appointing the twelve apostles, and what authority did he give them? [3] Read Mark 3:20-30. How did Jesus address the accusations from the scribes about being

possessed by Beelzebul, and what was his teaching on the unity of a kingdom or house? [4] Read Mark 3:31-35. How does Jesus define spiritual family values in the verses?

[5] Pray thanking God for His love and grace in your life and the truth found in scripture that nothing can take the gift of salvation away from you after you make Jesus Christ Lord of your life.

Mark 3:1-5 [also found in Matthew 12:9-14, and Luke 6:6-11 Again he entered the synagogue, and a man was there with a withered hand. ["deformity may have been a defect from birth or atrophy resulting from paralysis" ² And they watched Jesus, to see whether he would heal him on the Sabbath, so that they might accuse him.³ [So Jesus made a choice] And he said to the man with the withered hand, "Come here." ⁴ And he said to them [Pharisees and Teachers], "Is it lawful on the Sabbath to do good or to do harm, to save life or to kill?" But they were silent. ⁵ And he looked around at them with anger, grieved at their hardness of heart, [Mark 6:52, Romans 11:25, Ephesians 4:18] and said to the man, "Stretch out your ■ hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was restored. [opposite of | Kings 13:4] ⁶ The Pharisees went out and immediately [Matthew 12:14] held counsel with the Herodians against him, how to destroy him. [12:13, 8:15, Matthew 22:16] [first explicit reference to Jesus' death]

Mark 3:7-10 Jesus withdrew with his disciples to the sea, [from the conniving leaders, but not form the people] and a great crowd followed, from Galilee and Judea ^{8a} and Jerusalem and Idumea and from beyond the Jordan and from around Tyre and Sidon.^{8b} When the great crowd heard all that he was doing, they came to him. ⁹ And he told his disciples to have a boat ready for him because of the crowd, [6:32, 6:45, 8:10] lest they crush him, [5:24,31] ¹⁰ for he had healed many, so that all who had diseases pressed around him [5:29,34] to touch him. [6:56, Matthew 9:20-21, 14:36, Luke 6:19]

Mark 3:11-12 [Jesus shifts form healings to exorcisms] ¹¹ And whenever the unclean spirits saw him, [1:26, 1:34, Luke 4:41] they fell down before him [Luke 8:28] [posture of defeat - Jesus, having already defeated Satan, was the unclean spirits' master] and cried out, "You are the Son of God." [Matthew 14:33] ¹² And he strictly ordered them not to make him known. [Matthew 12:16]

Mark 3:13-19 [Appointment] And he went up on the mountain and called to him those whom he desired, and they ■ came to him. ¹⁴ And he appointed twelve (whom he also named apostles) so that they might be with him and he I might send them out to preach ¹⁵ and have authority to cast • out demons. ¹⁶ He appointed the twelve: [1] Simon (to • whom he gave the name Peter); 17 [2] James the son of Zebedee and [3] John the brother of James (to whom he gave the name Boanerges, that is, Sons of Thunder); [4] ¹⁸ Andrew, and [5] Philip, and [6] Bartholomew, and [7] Matthew, and [8] Thomas, and [9] James the son of Alphaeus, and [10] Thaddaeus, and [11] Simon the Zealot, ¹⁹ and [12] Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

Mark 3:20-21 [Assumption] Then he went home, and the crowd gathered again, so that they could not even eat. ²¹ And when his family heard it, they went out to seize him, [kratesai - capture him] for they were saying, "<u>He is out of his mind</u>." [John 7:5]

Mark 3:22 [Accusation] And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem were saying, "He is possessed by Beelzebul," [literally means, Master of the house] and "by the prince of demons he casts out the demons." [Matthew 9:34, 12:24, 10:25, Luke 11:15, John 7:20]

Mark 3:23-26 [Refutation] ²³ And he called them to him [his accusers] and <u>said to them in</u> <u>parables</u>, [Jesus' reply in parables was actually a threefold message that contrasted unity and disunity. Nothing—including Satan's kingdom can stand if it is divided. - NKJVSB] "How can Satan cast out Satan? [Matthew 12:25-29, Luke 11:17-22] ²⁴ If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. ²⁵ And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. ²⁶ And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but is coming to an end.

Mark 3:27 [Clarification] [NLT: Let me illiterate this further] But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his goods, unless he first binds the strong man. Then indeed he may plunder his house. Mark 3:28-30 "Truly, I say to you, all sins will be forgiven the children of man, and whatever blasphemies they utter, ²⁹ but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal $\sin^{\prime\prime}$ — ³⁰ for they were saying, "He has an unclean spirit." Mark 3:31-35 And his mother and his brothers came, and standing outside they sent to him and called him. 32 And a crowd was sitting around him, and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers are outside, seeking you." 33 And he answered them, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" ³⁴ And looking about at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! ³⁵ For whoever does the will of God, he is my

brother and sister and mother."

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
