

Reconciliation Philippians 3:17-4:1

Brothers, join in imitating me, and keep your eyes on those who walk according to the example you have in us. ¹⁸ For many, of whom I have often told you and now tell you even with tears, walk as enemies of the cross of Christ. ¹⁹ Their end is destruction, their god is their belly, and they glory in their shame, with minds set on earthly things. ²⁰ But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹ who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself.

^{4:1} Therefore, my brothers, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm thus in the Lord, my beloved.

Discussion Questions:

- Think of somebody who is worthy of imitating their walk with God. What spiritual fruit and disciplines do you see in their lives that are worth imitating? Discuss.
- In this passage, Paul explains that ungodly behavior is a product of a faulty mindset (3:19). Read Philippians 3:12-14 and compare and contrast the mindset of a person focused on Christ with the mindset of an individual who is focused on earthly things.
- In the interview with Jeremy, he kept mentioning the Kingdom of God. What is the Kingdom of God? Read this article from Ligonier Ministries, <u>The Kingdom of God by</u> <u>R.C. Sproul</u>, to get some good biblical insight about the Kingdom of God and the implications it has in your life. Discuss.
- 4. Paul calls the people of Philippi his current joy and partners in the hope of Christ together looking toward heaven (4:1). Paul challenges the church to stand firm. This is our calling as the body of Christ. Name three people who are standing side-by-side with you. Make it a priority to pray for them each day this week.
