## **Discussion Questions:**

- 1. Read Psalm 78:1. When do your ears perk up? What kinds of things distract you from listening to God when He speaks to you? Discuss.
- 2. Read Psalm 78:2-4. When and where have you seen God at work in your life or in the lives of those around you? Share your journey/testimony of how you came to know the Lord and how you have grown.
- 3. Read Psalm 78:5-6. Do you currently teach your children about God and His mighty deeds? If not, make a point of doing that on a regular basis beginning this week. If you do not have any children, find someone with whom you can share God with.
- 4. Read Psalm 78:7-8. If you want your children to follow and obey God, you need to have a PLAN. Start by reading your Bible on a daily basis and study what it says. Share with your children everything God has done in His Word as well as in your life. Share ideas with one another on what you can do to help the next generation.
