### The Temptation of Jesus

1. APPETITE - Q<sup>1</sup>: Does God's Word Sustain? (4:3-4) See Deuteronomy 8:1-4

- 2. AMBITION Q<sup>2</sup>: Does God's Word Satisfy? (4:5-8) See Psalm 107:1-9
- 3. PRIDE Q<sup>3</sup>: Does God's word give us an antidote for pride? (4:9-12)

See Deut. 6:16-19; Romans 12:1-2

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. 2 Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect. #### **Discussion Questions**

- 1. Read Deuteronomy 8:1-4. What did the wilderness mean to the Israelites (Deut. 8:2)? Has God tested you to know what is in your heart? In which area is God currently testing your heart? Discuss. (Q from Abide Bible)
- 2. Read Psalm 107:1-9. How do the promises of God's steadfast love satisfy the soul when we are in need (look at God's character and actions in the verses)? Discuss.
- 3. Pray asking God to give you hunger for His Word specifically in the area of temptation remembering His promise that when you are tempted He will also make a way of escape - 1 Cor. 10:13. (Q from Abide Bible)

Luke 4:1-13 And Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness<sup>2</sup> for forty days, being tempted by the devil. And he ate nothing during those days. And when they were ended, he was hungry. <sup>3</sup> The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread." 4 And Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone.'"

<sup>5</sup> And the devil took him up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time, <sup>6</sup> and said to him, "To you I will give all this authority and their glory, for it has been delivered to me, and I give it to whom I will. <sup>7</sup> If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours." 8 And Jesus answered him, "It is written, You shall worship the Lord your God, and him only shall you serve."

<sup>9</sup> And he took him to Jerusalem and set him on the pinnacle of the temple and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, <sup>10</sup> for it is written, "'He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you,' 11 and "'On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone.'" 12 And Jesus answered him,

#### "It is said, 'You shall not put the Lord your God to the test.""

<sup>13</sup> And when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed from him until an opportune time.

Deuteronomy 8:1-4 "The whole commandment that I command you today you shall be careful to do, that you may live and multiply, and go in and possess the land that the Lord swore to give to your fathers. <sup>2</sup> And you shall remember the whole way that the Lord your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, that he might humble you, testing you to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep his commandments or not. <sup>3</sup> And he humbled you and let you hunger and fed you with manna, which you did not know, nor did your fathers know, that he might make you know that man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord. <sup>4</sup> Your clothing did not wear out on you and your foot did not swell these forty years."

Psalm 107:1-9 Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever! 2 Let the redeemed of the Lord say so, whom he has redeemed from trouble 3 and gathered in from the lands, from the east and from the west, ■ from the north and from the south.

4 Some wandered in desert wastes, finding no way to a city to dwell in; 5 hungry and thirsty, their soul fainted within them. 6 Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, and he delivered them from their distress. 7 He led them by a straight way till they reached a city to dwell in.

8 Let them thank the Lord for his steadfast love, for his wondrous works to the children of man! 9 For he satisfies the I longing soul, and the hungry soul he fills with good things.

Deuteronomy 6:16-19 "You shall not put the Lord your God to the test, as you tested him at Massah. 17 You shall diligently keep the commandments of the Lord your God, and I his testimonies and his statutes, which he has commanded you. 18 And you shall do what is right and good in the sight of ■ the Lord, that it may go well with you, and that you may go in and take possession of the good land that the Lord swore to give to your fathers 19 by thrusting out all your enemies from before you, as the Lord has promised.
