"Remember How He Told You . . ." Luke 23:50 - 24:12

Memory #1

(Matt. 16:21-23; Mark 8:31-9:1; Luke 9:22-27)

Matthew 16:21 From that time Jesus began to show his disciples that He must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised.

Memory #2

(Matt. 17:22-23; Mark 9:30-32; Luke 9:43-45)

Mark 9:30-32 They went on from there and passed through Galilee. And he did not want anyone to know, ³¹ for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him. And when he is killed, after three days he will rise." ³² But they did not understand the saying, and were afraid to ask him.

Memory #3

(Matt. 20:17-19; Mark 10:32-34; Luke 18:31-33)

Luke 18:31-33 And taking the twelve, he said to them, "See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and everything that is written about the Son of Man by the prophets will be accomplished. ³² For he will be delivered over to the Gentiles and will be mocked and shamefully treated and spit upon. ³³ And after flogging him, they will kill him, and on the third day he will rise."

Memory #4

(Matt. 22:37-40; Mark. 12:35-37; Luke 20:41-44)

Matthew 22:37-40 . . . "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. ³⁸ This is the great and first commandment. ³⁹ And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. ⁴⁰ On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets."

Luke 23:50-56 Now there was a man named Joseph, from the Jewish town of Arimathea. He was a member of the council, a good and righteous man, ⁵¹ who had not consented to their decision and action; and he was looking ■ for the kingdom of God. ⁵² This man went to Pilate and asked I for the body of Jesus. 53 Then he took it down and wrapped it in a linen shroud and laid him in a tomb cut in stone, where no one had ever yet been laid. 54 It was the day of Preparation, and the Sabbath was beginning. 55 The women who had come with him from Galilee followed and saw the tomb and how his body was laid. ⁵⁶ Then they returned and prepared spices and ointments.

Luke 24:1-12 But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared.² And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they went in they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling apparel. ⁵ And as they were frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, "Why do you seek the living among ■ the dead? ⁶ He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, 7 that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and on the third day rise." 8 And they remembered his words, ⁹ and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest. ¹⁰ Now it was Mary Magdalene and Joanna and Mary the mother of James and the other women with them who told these things to the apostles, ¹¹ but these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. ¹² But Peter rose and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; and he went home marveling at what had happened.

Hebrews 12:1-2 Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ² looking to Jesus, ■ the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

Discussion Questions

- 1. Read Luke 23:50-56 and Isaiah 53:9. Isaiah 53:9 is a prophetic verse about the burial of Jesus found in the gospels that was written hundred of years before the crucifixion, death, and burial of Jesus -Jesus was buried just as God said he would be. How does seeing this connection affect you? Does it give you confidence in your walk with God? Discuss.
- 2. Read Luke 24:1-12. Which people do you relate to the most in these verses? Why? Discuss.
- 3. Read Hebrews 12:1-2 and Matthew 22:37-40. Hebrews 12:2 gives us insight that from the beginning of his journey Jesus embraced the cross because of the joy that he would experience after He gave His life for us - bringing salvation and relationship to those who believe in Him. How does this truth impact you? Discuss.
- 4. Pray together asking to God to help us to stay focused on what He has told us by spending time with Him everyday learning about Him through His word.
