THE WHY OF WORK

What we can learn from the 1st Century Bondservant Colossians 3:22-4:1

A. BONDSERVANTS (22-25)

- 1. The Calling (3:22a): Obey your masters
- 2. The Struggle (3:22b): Call to Integrity
 - a. Don't give eye-service [ophthalmodoulia]
 - b. Don't be people-pleasers [anthropareskoi]
 - c. Be sincere heart check [haploteti Eph 6:6a]
 - d. Fear the Lord [phoboumenoi ton Kyrion]
- 3. The Expectation (3:23-24):
 - a. Energy/Perspective (3:23) [Eph. 6:5b]
 - b. Motivation (3:24a): Inheritance [I Cor. 6:20]
 - c. Focus (3:24b): Glorifying God [6:5c]
- 4. The Promise (3:25) : Justice

B. MASTERS (4:1)

- 1. The Expectation (4:1a):
 - a. Justice [dikaios righteously]
 - b. Fairness [isotés: equality in treatment]
- 2. The Motivation (4:1b): Glorifying God

Discussion Questions

- 1. Read Romans 1:1 and 6:6-7. Paul tells us who we are and what we are in these verses - servants of Christ and free from sin! How do these two parts of your identity in Christ affect your daily life?
- 2. Read Colossians 3:10-11.The lifestyle of a believer is patterned after the attitudes and actions of Christ who is at work within them. Where do you or do you not see these Christ-like patterns in your life?
- 3. Read Colossians 3:23-24. After reading these verses are there any behaviors, attitudes, or thoughts you need to align with God's call to glorify Him in your work?
- 4. Pray for God to use you as a reflection of His glory when and where you work and serve.

THEY ULTIMATE WHY?

TAKING A DEEPER LOOK AT WHO WE ARE, WHAT WE DO, AND WHY WE DO WHAT WE DO ROMANS 1:1 Paul, a servant [doulos] of Christ
 Jesus, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of
 God, . . .

ROMANS 6:6-7 We know that our old self was crucified
with him in order that the body of sin might be brought
to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved
[douleuó: to be a slave, to serve] to sin. 7 For one who
has died has been set free from sin. [TRUE FREEDOM]

COLOSSIANS 3:10-11: . . . having put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator ¹¹ Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, <u>slave</u>, free; but Christ is all, and in all.

COLOSSIANS 3:22-25: Bondservants, obey in everything those who are your earthly masters, not by way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but with sincerity of heart, fearing the Lord. ²³ Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, ²⁴ knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ. ²⁵ For the wrongdoer will be paid back for the wrong he has done, and there is no partiality.

COLOSSIANS 4:1: Masters, treat your **Bondservants** justly and fairly, knowing that you also have a Master in heaven.

I CORINTHIANS 7:21-24: Were you a bondservant when called? Do not be concerned about it. (But if you can gain your freedom, avail yourself of the opportunity.) ²² For he who was called in the Lord as a bondservant is a freedman of the Lord. Likewise he who was free when called is a bondservant of Christ. ²³ You were bought with a price; do not become bondservants of men. ²⁴ So, brothers, in whatever condition each was called, there let him remain with God.

PHILEMON 8-16 Accordingly, though I am bold enough ■ in Christ to command you to do what is required, ⁹ yet for love's sake I prefer to appeal to you— I, Paul, an old man and now a prisoner also for Christ Jesus- 10 I appeal to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I became in 🛽 my imprisonment. ¹¹ (Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful to you and to me.) ¹² I am sending him back to you, sending my very heart. ¹³ I would have been glad to keep him with me, in order that he might serve me on your behalf during my imprisonment for the gospel, 14 but I preferred to do nothing without your consent in order that your goodness might not be by compulsion but of your own accord. ¹⁵ For this perhaps is why he was parted from you for a while, that you might have him back forever, ¹⁶ no longer as a bondservant but more than a bondservant, as a beloved brother—especially to me, but **1** how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

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
