Discussion Questions

- 1. Read Hebrews 3:12-13. Scripture reveals that the Pharisees were cynical about Jesus and his ministry. What 5 hypocritical behaviors did Jesus point out were rooted in their lives that affected their spiritual life and hindered their ministry?
- 2. Read the four antidotes to cynicism driven by a commitment to cultivating curiosity. Which ones do you think you need to work on?
- 3. Pray for God to cultivate a "Holy Curiosity" in you this week.

Ecclesiastes 1:8 All things are full of weariness; a man cannot utter it; the eye is not satisfied with seeing, nor the ear filled with hearing.

Hebrews 3:12-13 Take care, brothers, lest there be in any of you an evil, unbelieving heart, leading you to fall away from the living God. 13 But exhort one another every day, as Iong as it is called "today," that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin.

Matthew 23 [7 Woes to the Pharisees]

[1] Hypocrisy that led to keeping people out of the Kingdom of Heaven - points to their rejection of Christ [13]

[2] Hypocritical leadership to the new converts - the led their converts into religion [driven by works], instead of true righteousness [15]

[3] Lack of focus on teaching truth, and using their time debating and arguing about irrelevant things and finding loopholes in the law - blind guides and blind fools [16-22]

[4] Committed to avoiding offenses in minor things of little importance, while tolerating or committing great sins ignoring the important matters of the law: justice mercy, and faithfulness.— strain out a gnat but swallow a camel. [23]

[5-7] They kept up the appearance of purity and holiness, but inside they were dark and dirty - full of greed and selfindulgence. [25-30

- [a] Dishes intensely cleaned on the outside but dirty on the inside
- [b] Whitewashed tombs full of dead bones on the inside
- [c] Hypocrisy of the monuments that were built for the prophets their ancestor had killed

Philippians 4:8 Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.

Proverbs 1:5 Let the wise hear and increase in learning, and the one who understands obtain guidance,

Proverbs 18:2 A fool takes no pleasure in understanding, but only in expressing his opinion.
