- 1] Led the Lost Home Satisfied Their Soul [Ps. 107:9]
- 2] Brought Them Out Into Light, Life, & Freedom [Luke 4:18f]
- 3] Sent our His Word Healed and Delivered Them [Ps. 107:16; Jeremiah 30:17]
- 4] Calmed the Storm Relieved the Anxiety and Brought them Safely to Their Destination [I Pet. 5:6-7]

Discussion Questions

- 1. What patterns do you see in Psalm 107 with people in despair and God's response?
- Choose one of the four situations described in Psalm 107: a wanderer lost in a desert wasteland (vv. 4–9), a prisoner chained in a dark dungeon (vv. 10–16), a foolish sinner caught in sin's consequences (vv. 17–22), and a sailor whose ship seems to be sinking in a great storm (vv. 23– 30). Think about what you might experience in a similar situation.
- 3. Pray for yourself or for someone you love who may be in the desperate situation you thought about; As you pray thank the Lord for His *chesed* toward you and others. [Questions 2 and 3 are from the NKJV Abide Bible]

Psalm 107 Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love [chesed] endures forever! ² Let the redeemed of the Lord say so, whom he has redeemed from trouble ³ and gathered in from the lands, from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.

⁴ Some wandered in desert wastes, finding no way to a city to dwell
in ⁵ hungry and thirsty, their soul fainted within them. ⁶ Then
they cried to the Lord in their trouble, and he delivered them from
their distress. ⁷ He led them by a straight way till they reached a city
to dwell in. ⁸ Let them thank the Lord for his steadfast love [chesed],
for his wondrous works to the children of man! ⁹ For he satisfies the
longing soul, and the hungry soul he fills with good things.

¹⁰ Some sat in darkness and in the shadow of death, prisoners
in affliction and in irons, ¹¹ for they had rebelled against the words of
God, and spurned the counsel of the Most High. ¹² So he bowed their
hearts down with hard labor; they fell down, with none to help.
¹³ Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, and he delivered them
from their distress. ¹⁴ He brought them out of darkness and the
shadow of death, and burst their bonds apart. ¹⁵ Let them thank
the Lord for his steadfast love [chesed], for his wondrous works to the
children of man! ¹⁶ For he shatters the doors of bronze and cuts in
two the bars of iron.

¹⁷ Some were fools through their sinful ways, and because of their iniquities suffered affliction; ¹⁸ they loathed any kind of food, and they drew near to the gates of death. ¹⁹ Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, and he delivered them from their distress. ²⁰ He sent out his word and healed them, and delivered them from their destruction. ²¹ Let them thank the Lord for his steadfast love [chesed], for his wondrous works to the children of man! ²² And let them offer sacrifices of thanksgiving, and tell of his deeds in songs of joy!

²³ Some went down to the sea in ships, doing business on the great waters; ²⁴ they saw the deeds of the Lord, his wondrous works in the deep. ²⁵ For he commanded and raised the stormy wind, which lifted up the waves of the sea. ²⁶ They mounted up to heaven; they went down to the depths; their courage melted away in their evil plight; ²⁷ they reeled and staggered like drunken men and were at their wits' end. ²⁸ Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, and he delivered them from their distress. ²⁹ He made the storm be still, and the waves of the sea were hushed. ³⁰ Then they were glad that the waters were quiet, and he brought them to their desired haven. ³¹ Let them thank the Lord for his steadfast love [chesed], for his wondrous works to the children of man! ³² Let them extol him in the congregation of the people, and praise him in the assembly of the elders.

I Peter 5:6-7 Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you, 7 casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you.

John 8:36 If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.
